Progress Energy's ongoing success depends upon the performance of our people and doing what is right by our neighbours, our employees and our stakeholders. We integrate responsible governance, planning and practices into our all our business activities, and we demonstrate our commitment by ensuring safety, environmental and social considerations are carefully managed throughout the life cycle of our operations. We believe using this ethical approach to doing business is essential to our social license to operate.

Progress is committed to a proactive approach in developing a positive and open relationship with the communities where we operate. As such these "Good Neighbor Guidelines" should be considered the standard in how representatives of Progress Energy, including staff, consultants and contractors are to behave and interact with those in the community.

As a representative of Progress Energy these guiding principles are to be adhered to:

Conduct

- Show respect to our neighbours and communities where we operate. Respectful and well-mannered behavior with our neighbours, communities and stakeholders is expected both during and after work hours.
- Maintain open, respectful two way communication with our neighbours and stakeholders to improve understanding of their concerns and perspectives.
- Treat the wildlife habitat and environment where we operate with respect, care and awareness of our impact.
- Understand and follow the rules and requirements outlined by Progress Energy regarding Drugs and Alcohol

Safe Driving Practices

- Adhere to all traffic laws
- Practice courteous and defensive driving protocols on all public, private and resource roads to improve the safety and driving experience for all users. Specifically, be aware of speed zones, road hazards, traffic volumes, safe following and passing guidelines and applicable radio protocol requirements
- Use only designated traffic routes, access roads and trails. Do not use private roads unless the owners or residents have been notified.

Dust and Emissions Reduction


- Be aware of our neighbours and communities. Respect residents and others whose close proximity exposes them to dust or emissions and use practices that will reduce dust and emissions.
- Reduce speeds on gravel roads to lessen the amount of dust.
- Turn off any equipment that produces air emissions when not in use to reduce environmental impact (Idling trucks, generators)

Housekeeping

- Ensure general upkeep and housekeeping of lease land, roads and surrounding area is maintained.
- Garbage and recycling is to be disposed of properly in appropriate receptacles.
- Clean sites before moving off-lease.
- Secure all materials in the back of trucks and on the worksite.
- Hazardous materials are to be handled and disposed of in accordance with regulations.


Noise and Light Impact

- Understand and adhere to all applicable noise and light impact regulations.
- Schedule loud or noisy activities during standard hours or hours with minimal impact (9am-5pm) when practicable.
- Take all practicable measures to reduce noise and light impact – mufflers, baffles, sound or light barriers and position equipment to reduce impact on neighbours.
- Ensure equipment is functioning properly and not making any unnecessary noise.
- Shut down equipment if not in use to prevent noise and light impact – e.g. idling trucks, generators.




